How to get there

You arrive at Ferihegy Airport in Budapest, Hungary.

From Ferihegy Airport you can take a taxi (30 minutes, costs about 25-30 Euro) or public transportation.

At Ferihegy Airport take bus **200E**. Get off the bus at: **Kőbánya-Kispest** (last stop of the bus).

Follow the signs **M3**. Take the subway **M3**. Get off the metro at: **Deák tér** (10 stops).

At Deák tér follow the sign **M2**. Take the subway **M2** towards Moszkva tér. Get off the subway at **Batthyány tér** (only 2 stops).

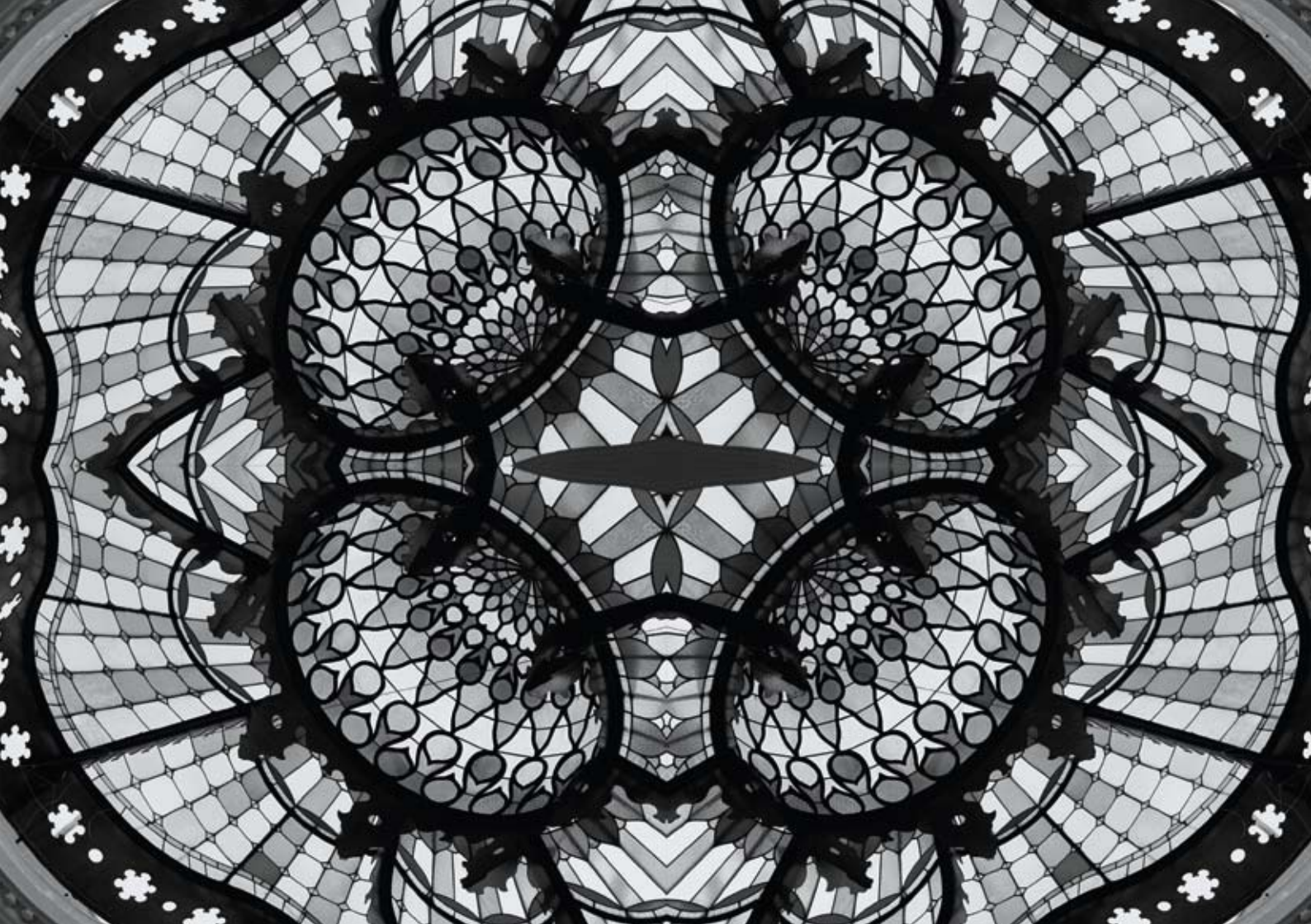
