## Minutes of SIG Reproductive Endocrinology, ESHRE, Barcelona, 8<sup>th</sup> July 2008.

The meeting was co-chaired by N.M. and A.B.. The new committee was present, apart from J G-V who gave his apologies. In attendance approximately 15 members of the SIG.

We need to make our proposals annually and budget for 2009 by mid-September. N.M stated that he would draw up a budget for the forthcoming meetings already planned.

It was agreed that this year's pre-congress course *Gender Specific Medicine:* Redefining Reproductive Endocrinology had been highly rated.

N.M. outlined the meetings so far planned for the forthcoming twelve months:

- Basic Principals in Ovarian Physiology: Relevance for IVF, Lisbon, Portugal 19 20 September 2008.
- The Menopause and its Management: a revisit, Edinburgh, Scotland 6 7 October 2008.
- The 4th Course on Molecular Basics and Translational Studies in Reproductive Medicine, Molecular Reproductive Medicine, Thessaloniki, Greece 10 - 11 October 2008.
- Mild approaches to stimulation, Mirabor, Slovenia, 6-7 February 2009.
- Next year's pre-congress course will be run jointly with the SIG on Safety and Quality in ART and will focus on Mild stimulation strategies in IVF.

We have also been asked to contribute to a satellite meeting on fetal physiology and periconception at the SGI meeting in Glasgow, 18-21<sup>st</sup> March 2009, where there will be an ESHRE Campus Symposium on Periconceptional Determinants of Health.

ESHRE have established a new Task Force in Basic Sciences, chaired by Johan Smitz. Richard Anderson will represent the SIG.

Basil Tarlatzis stated that in 2010 there will be a third PCOS consensus meeting on *Medical Problems associated with PCOS*, probably in Amsterdam at the end of September (proposed 29-30<sup>th</sup>).
